**Course Description:** "Canine Liability 360" is still rated by its attendees as the most comprehensive liability course being offered today to handlers and K9 supervisors. (*This class is not recommended for detection only handlers.*) Participants will benefit from the firsthand experiences and recommendations of the instructor as well as others as some recent cases and incidents not found in "case law updates" are reviewed and discussed and the lessons learned shared.

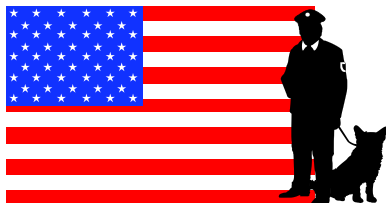
